

He is a graduate of Paier College of Art of New Haven along with graduate classes at the School of Visual Arts in New York. He has also worked as art director and creative director for some of Connecticut and New York's most prestigious advertising agencies, simultaneous exhibiting in galleries and museums throughout the United States. Currently he sits on the board of The Hudson Valley Art Association, is an elected member of The Connecticut Plein Air Painters, elected member of The Lyme Art Association, and an elected member of The Rockport Art Association. He has received numerous awards including First Place Lyme Art Association's New England Landscape Invitational, People's Choice Award – New Britain Museum of American Art, and a finalist in the Artist Magazine Landscape competition. He has exhibited in the Mystic Museum International Marine Exhibition, The Butler Institute of American Art, the Mattatuck Museum and The New Britain Museum of American Art, The Maritime Gallery at Mystic Seaport, Bayview Gallery, Gregory James Gallery, and the Bryan Memorial Gallery.

My paintings spring from a lifelong fascination with the outdoors. This fascination, present even in my earliest memories, has greatly influenced my personal, academic and professional pursuits, and most significantly, my artwork. The moods, mystery, and atmosphere along with inherent design of nature intrigue me, and I seek to unveil and express those qualities in my paintings, trying to document a specific place and time. What I am looking for is very elusive, that play of light and form along with design, a frozen moment in time. My goal is to share that special time and place, hoping that the viewer will feel the same emotions that I do. It is self-evident that the single-family farms and working harbors are threatened and rapidly vanishing. Still, there is a physical, emotional, and spiritual element that remains evident. I choose to capture the inspiration of what still remains, rather than what has been lost. I am

a Contemporary Realist, and my paintings are characterized by the thoughtful process of composition using natures and man-made elements to evoke a true sense of place. They are subtle in color and strong in mood.

Natalia Andreeva


Florida

The artistic talents of Natalia Andreeva stem from the hand of a woman born and bred on the harsh yet beautiful landscapes of Siberia, in Novosibirsk, Russia. Emerging from that chilly land comes a delicate sensitivity for both watercolors and traditional oils that stem from a warm heart and a fertile mind. Andreeva's studies in traditional art forms have led her in pursuit of mastery over portraits, landscapes, and still life paintings. In each work, her concentration on form and composition are reminiscent of realist works, while her daring use of color and simulated light shows a deep love of modern techniques. The combination of traditional genres with skill in a variety of techniques allows Andreeva an endless playground to develop her ideas. Educated at the prestigious Novosibirsk State Pedagogical Institute, she received a superb education in art and art history and found unrivaled studio experience, which she continued with her education in Moscow. Her work continues to evolve, and her reputation precedes her as her art receives new praise across the United States. Andreeva holds Signature Membership Status in the American Impressionist Society, and she is past president of the Tallahassee Watercolor Society.

From my early childhood I was intrigued and fascinated by the enigma of art, this magical process that turns "nothing" into the harmonic tune of chaos. I adore this something that gives birth to new feelings and associations. Learning art techniques did not diminish my interest and surprise; on the contrary, it has deepened my passion for art. In fact, all this may be the reason why the actual process of creation gives me the most pleasure. Each work is a continuation of the quest, and each new step develops my feelings and intensifies my exploration of the magic of art. I prefer a personal experience of my subjects, painting landscapes, portraits, still life on location; and I follow my mood in choosing the motive. I love color. I believe it is power, it burns, it cools, it speaks, and I think it is part of the spell.

Olena Babak is a nationally recognized artist who has received awards from *Plein Air Magazine*, Oil Painters of America, National Oil and Acrylic Painters Society, Art Renewal Center and numerous plein air competitions across the country. Her work has been featured in *Plein Air Magazine* and *Fine Art Connoisseur*. Babak's studio is in Maine, and she enjoys traveling all over the country participating in plein air/gallery competitions/events, and teaching workshops. Her selected awards include First Place, People's Choice and Artist's Choice Forgotten Coast 2023; Best Use of Light, Plein Air Easton, 2023; and Second Place, Door County Plein Air, 2023.

Painting plein air for me is a journey in pursuit of natural beauty created by the effects of light, shadow and color. With a cup of coffee in hand, often before sunrise, I will find myself in the fresh crisp air of the morning grabbing my art gear and heading out to look for a spot that will provide inspiration for the day. Often, I will find myself by the water where the sparkles, reflections, and beautifully silhouetted shapes evoke a happiness inside that tells me that I'm in the right place for my next painting. The Geometry of Farm Life, Beth Bathe Royal Talens Award

Pennsylvania

Hailing from Strasburg, PA, Beth Bathe's award-winning representational paintings have been described by art critics as "evoking nostalgia, like that of an old sepia toned photograph, often with just touches of color." Curiosity about the medium Bathe works is often the first question of many viewers. Is it watercolor, is it oil? She responds that it is somewhat both. She works with water mixable oil colors in a limited palette, using brushes and unconventional tools. Bathe crisscrosses the country, painting en plein air and participating in up to 10 high-profile juried and invitation national competitions a year.

My representational paintings have been described by art critics as "evoking nostalgia, like that of an old sepia toned photograph, often with just touches of color." My subject matter includes finding beauty in buildings that are often beyond their prime. They might be abandoned, or derelict, or soon to become part of the vanishing landscape. Painting primarily on location en plein air allows me to catch my subject at a specific time, ideally when the light and shadows play on the surface creating drama and emotion.

Barbara Berry's artistic journey has led her along a winding road, reigniting her passion for painting. Growing up she was surrounded by nature and works of art. The artistry of her mother, her earliest mentor, influenced her creative spirit. Berry would watch as her mother sketched portraits of the neighbor's children. Their home was filled with realist and impressionist drawings and paintings of rare falcons, landscapes and portraits. Inspired by her mother, Berry believed she could draw and paint. At 10 years old, she sold her first artwork to her school principal, a moment that confirmed her desire to keep painting. However, she found herself studying classical voice during her university years, resulting in a successful career captivating audiences with her operatic roles in Germany. Eventually she returned to her American roots, where she cherished the responsibility of raising her children. As her children embarked on their own educational journeys, Berry pursued a self-guided art education, taking courses at the Wayne Art Center and private workshops with artists throughout the country. Her artistic experiences are a tapestry that combines the natural world, music, and a dedication to honing her craft, and she has been working in earnest to capture rhythm and light and her response on canvas, inviting viewers into a realm where brushstrokes illuminate the wonders that surround us.

In my paintings I strive to capture daylight's dance across grass and creeks, animals and faces, and with these impressions I aim to inspire an appreciation for the sublime in nature and humanity.

Lon Brauer is an American artist known for his painting of figure and plein air landscape. Born in 1955 and coming of age in the early seventies, he has roots in the Abstract Expressionist movement. His work is a mixture of the abstract and the representational, bringing an impressionistic use of paint and materials to create images that challenge the viewer with new perspectives.

There is a performance that takes place between the blank canvas on one end and the finished result on the other. This is where art makes itself known. One can have a goal in mind, but the excitement comes with not really knowing what outcome will present. Painting is about painting. It is a journey. If a picture is the result ... all the better.







Dead Quiet, Thomas Bucci Best Architecture Asward




Thomas Bucci

Thomas Bucci's journey from graphic designer to architect to full-time artist has been an evolving creative path. A background in design and architecture influences his artistic style, adding depth and structure to his work. Bucci lives in Maine, and paints on location and directly from life at every opportunity.

I've chosen watercolor for its gestural quality, capriciousness, and spontaneity. Watercolor allows me to quickly suggest the main shapes with loose washes. Then a few well-placed marks with a flicker of a brush tip conjure the illusion of detail, without actually painting all those details and leads the eye to recognize familiar objects. The viewer "sees" things that aren't really there. It allows them to participate in the painting as they decipher the marks and interpret the scene. This approach requires me to work quickly which has its risks; risks I'm willing to take to realize watercolor's potential.

John Caggiano is a Signature Member of nine national organizations, including American Impressionist Society, American Society of Marine Artists, National Oil and Acrylic Painters Society, and the Salmagundi Club. He travels extensively in the United States and Europe, painting in his Impressionistic-Realism style. Additionally, he participates in many major plein air events annually. Some recent awards are the Texas Ranchland and Best Architecture Awards — En Plein Air Texas, Best in Show — Outdoor Painters Society, Best Artist Over 65 — Plein Air Salon, *Plein Air Magazine*, Life on the Farm Award — Plein Air Easton, and Stobart Foundation Award — Mystic International. He has been featured in 24 editorial features and an artist profile in *Plein Air Magazine* and *Fine Art Connoisseur*. Caggiano maintains a gallery in Rockport, Massachusetts.

I have been painting for 60 years, 45 of them as a professional. My travels take me across the United States and Europe. My subjects emphasize color, light, and shadow, which I interpret in an Impressionistic-Realism style. Painting, for me, is the bold and dynamic use of color that infuses life into the subject of the painting. Color is the lifeblood of a painting. Nothing stimulates me more than its pleasing harmony, whether strongly applied or toned and tranquil. The use of a palette knife enhances my brushwork. Painting outdoors satisfies both the eye and the soul. It trains one to see and feel more aesthetically and clearly. I admire many artists for these qualities. Willard Metcalf, Daniel Garber, Childe Hassam, Albert Pinkham Ryder, and Joaquin Sorolla are some of my role models. Plein air events enrich my painting experience. However, my greatest joy is painting with friends and colleagues who live and breathe art.

Henry Coe earned an MFA from the Maryland Institute College of Art. He prefers to paint outside, in front of the subject matter, en plein air. While working as a teacher and curator, He began painting seriously on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. Coe did an artist residency in China and three residencies in France and made many other painting visits to France. His work has been featured in *American Artist Magazine* and the book *100 Plein Air Painters of the Mid-Atlantic*. Coe did his first Plein air event in 2016 and has done many similar events since then. While participating in Plein Air Easton 2022, his painting *Hay Bales* won the Life on The Farm Award. Recently, in May 2023, his painting *Old Ridge Road* won Best in Show at the Wayne Art Center Plein Air Festival in Wayne, PA. His work is represented by the C. Grimaldis Gallery in Baltimore and the Trippe Gallery in Easton, MD.

I paint the lengthening shadows and lowering light that occur toward the end of day or the soft diffused light of early morning. I want my work to have a sense of light traveling through air in space. The changing effects of the sky on the land are often essential to me in painting. I also look for the light and shadow of a landscape I see as disappearing, including small family farms or the rural industrial look that once was representative of many small towns.



Nebraska-based artist Beth Cole creates contemporary landscape paintings in oil. Her work centers on fields, trees, streams and buildings, and the effects of the atmosphere and light upon them. Piano was her first art form as it taught her a way of expressing emotion through touch, tempo and interpretation. Her love for "speaking" in this way is what inspired her exploration into painting in 2012. She has studied with many generous and accomplished painters including Jay Moore, Dave Santillanes, and Scott Christensen. Her award-winning work has been shown widely in Nebraska and the surrounding states. She lives with her husband Gary, and their beloved pup dog, Willow, in a small rural community near the Nebraska Sandhills. They have two grown children and three grandsons with whom they enjoy spending as much time as possible.

When I step into the landscape as a painter, I see before me the chaos of nature. My approach is to simplify what I see, transform chaos into order if you will, and create a peaceful and calming piece of art. My background in piano from a young age is what led me to painting, and it continues to inform all my work. Like "touch" in piano, my painting marks communicate energy, calmness, mood and atmosphere. Small studies of value and color help me to organize what I see. I am friends with many of the painting mediums, but oil is my best friend and what I use most often. My pencil has also become a trusted advisor. I hope my work conveys the peacefulness of my heart which I try to share with paint, brushes, and canvas.



Joshua Cunningham lives in St. Paul, Minnesota, with his wife, Shannon, and their children, Greta and William. His path to becoming a professional artist was as winding as the country roads and nameless creeks from his youth in rural Minnesota. For Cunningham, plein air painting brought him back to his rural roots and his imagination at the same time. He has been a professional artist for 20 years. He is a member of the Outdoor Painters of Minnesota, Oil Painters of America, and a signature member of the American Impressionist Society. His work has been on the cover of *Plein Air Magazine*. He has exhibited at Sotheby's, the Science Museum of Minnesota, the Bell Museum of Natural History, and the Minnesota Marine Art Museum. In 2024, his work was archived as part of a cultural time capsule on the moon, in the Lunar Codex, aboard the Odysseus Lander.

We are here for a time. Barns are here for a time. Cities are here for a time. Few experiences are as challenging or enriching as painting on location. It isn't long before I find myself defending my work against mercurial skies and the constant march of the sun. Shadows move, and colors change, leaving me to paint from memory. The field studies are finished works in their own right. They hold in them the intense experience of their creation. In the studio, these paintings return me to the scene, bringing back not only what I saw but also the sounds, smells, and stories shared by the passing stranger. It is all in the paint — along with dust from the fields and grit from the road. The work reflects the visual and visceral experiences of a vibrant and spontaneous exploration of our shared connection to the natural world.

John Eiseman has been painting since he was a teenager. He attended the Maryland Institute College of Art and graduated Magna Cum Laude in 1981. His paintings have won numerous awards and have been accepted into many national exhibitions, including the Oil Painters of America, American Impressionist Society and the National Oil and Acrylic Painter's Society. Recently, in June 2022 and July 2024 *Plein Air Salon Magazine*, Eiseman was awarded the "Best Plein Air Landscape." *Modern Impressionist Magazine* awarded him 3rd place overall national for January 2025. He is a member of the prestigious Washington Society of Landscape Painters. Eiseman also writes narratives of his plein air adventures and has been published *in Plein Air Magazine*. His work is represented by The Troika Gallery in Easton, MD, and The Main Street Gallery in Annapolis, MD.

My work encompasses several genres: plein air and studio landscapes, still life interiors, and figures. I use acrylics, oils, and watercolors. My paintings are surely representational and narrative at times, but the imagery is not about the pictorial. I use subject matter (whether it be a farmhouse, tree, cloud, or figure) as design elements to capture natural phenomena, moments in space and time, and mood of events. I believe that painting is not just the celebration of vision, but rather a quest for experience. In this sense, my paintings are not a recording of facts seen. It is the process of interpreting a fleeting muse. I consider myself to be an "American Impressionist" with "caveats."

Tracy Everly is an award-winning painter based in Bucks County. Mostly self-taught, she has occasionally studied at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts but built her artistic path through what a fellow artist described as "dogged determination and love of art." Her work has earned numerous awards and been exhibited nationwide. In addition to painting for over 30 years, she also teaches workshops across the country. Everly's work is represented by Morpeth Contemporary in Hopewell, NJ, and Edgewater Gallery in Middlebury, VT.

I paint to interpret, to explore and to share. Most of my paintings are about the passage of time and the fleeting experience of being human. I don't aim to capture one static moment or every detail. I observe and paint and distill different moments into a simplified form that is ultimately meant to capture the remains of an experience.

Martin Geiger is a figurative painter and draftsman who works and lives in Staunton, VA. He was trained at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts and graduated in 2019. He has received two Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation Grants, one in 2018 and one in 2022. He currently teaches at the Beverly Street Studio School and works as a part-time apprentice at Bronze Craft Foundry in Waynesboro, VA.

To Geiger, the world itself seems almost like an immense playground of a kind. Everything in his surroundings feels and looks intensely interesting at all times. It seems always to be right on the cusp of revealing itself, somewhat like a piece of music leading up to a crescendo. It's clear that there is something very important just beneath the surface for the artist and making art is his best attempt at excavating these ever-present patterns and showing them to the world. This nonstop sense of being called by reality means that the subject of his works varies widely from figure compositions to complex architecture to landscape, but the work itself generally gravitates towards light, space and design. These formal adjectives seem to most closely correlate with what Geiger wishes to communicate about the playground of life.

Jacob Houghton (b. 1998) is an oil painter whose creative path bridges the digital and traditional art worlds. His formal education includes studies in Video Game Art at Becker College, online courses with animation industry professionals, and a mentorship in classical painting techniques, during which he learned to mull his own oil paints and work with egg-based mediums. Houghton has displayed his work in solo and group exhibitions, including *Open for Interpretation* at the Franklin Public Library, the juried group show *Faces and Facades* at AHA Gallery in Atlantic Highlands, and other venues throughout New England. His artistic achievements have reached international audiences, with prints shipped worldwide and album covers designed for musicians. Blending the immediacy of plein air painting with the depth of studio work, Houghton's art reflects a profound connection to nature, a respect for tradition, and a dedication to creating works that resonate universally.

Whether I'm in a blizzard or getting eaten alive by mosquitos on a summer night, I experience the most peace when I am out painting. There's an urgency that accompanies painting in nature — an urgency that breeds mistakes, redemption, and invention. Art has always been integral to me. My grandmother was an accomplished painter, and I have been surrounded by her work my whole life. When she could no longer paint because of health issues, she gifted my mother and I her brushes and her oils. At this time, I was developing digital art for video games and mobile apps. I pivoted and jumped fully into learning traditional painting. Not only is plein air painting now a source of peace for me, but it's also how I study the world. I use the information I learn outside to create paintings from imagination. Art for me is communication, expression, and equilibrium.

Debra Howard is an award-winning plein air painter whose adventurous spirit shapes her art. She has been juried into and won competitions across Maryland, Pennsylvania, New York, Michigan, Maine, Georgia, Delaware, New Jersey, Tennessee, Indiana, Texas, Louisiana, and Virginia, including prestigious events like Easton Plein Air, Paint Annapolis, En Plein Air Texas, and Bath County Plein Air. She is a Signature Member of the Mid-Atlantic Plein Air Painters Association and the Glen Arbor Art Association. Howard has served as Artist-in-Residence at Tangier Island, Sleeping Bear Dunes, Big Cypress National Preserve, the Everglades, and South Carolina State Parks. Her work has appeared in *American Scholar*, Art *Connoisseur*, and *Plein Air Magazine*, plus numerous newspapers. As a U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Marine officer with a 100-ton master's license, she spent 27 years sailing before trading her boat for an RV — where she's been known to paint from the roof for a fresh perspective.

My work reflects a lifetime shaped by vivid landscapes. Raised in Miami amid intense light, color, and contrast, I later spent 27 years sailing Ling Ling through Hawaii, Mexico, Central America, the Caribbean, and the Bahamas. Surrounded by turquoise waters, coral hues, and rainforest greens, I began to paint. My unconventional palette — three colors plus white — draws on classical color theory to create harmonious, striking compositions. Influenced by my early career as a designer and illustrator, my paintings emphasize strong design and rhythmic flow. Each piece is a series of deliberate choices, translating the ever-changing 3D world onto a 2D panel. Through expressive brushstrokes, enhanced color, and dynamic patterns, I aim to share the wonder I've witnessed — inviting viewers into a dialogue with nature's beauty.




Qiang Huang




Neal Hughes



Fred Jackson has sketched outdoor landscapes since a young age with his father who is an artist. "Some dads play catch with their sons; my dad took me outdoors to draw," said Jackson. His interest in art and nature guided him to the design field of landscape architecture, where for 30 years he practiced as a landscape architect. Jackson now pursues painting full time. He began oil painting about 10 years ago with a desire to explore a personal appreciation of the landscape and creative process. Jackson participates in many prestigious national pein air events across the country, including Wayne Plein Air, PA; Gloucester Invitational Plein Air, VA; Plein Air Easton, MD; Door County Invitational, WI; Paint Annapolis, MD; the Olmsted Invitational Plein Air, Atlanta, GA; the Adirondack Plein Air, Saranac Lake, NY; and many others. He participates in about eight plein air events a year. He has gallery representations at The Square Pear Gallery, Kennett Square, PA; Bryan Gallery, Jeffersonville, and Stowe, VT; The Gallery at Mad River Valley Arts, Waitsfield, VT; and Church Street Gallery, West Chester, PA.

As a plein air painter, I am most inspired by the felt moods and patterns found in natural and built landscapes. My painting style is loose, bold, and expressive. I like to start with thin washes of dark or bright transparent colors. As the composition develops, I apply opaque thick paint with large brushes and pallet knives. I like my paintings to have a strong composition inspired by accurate representation of a place, which I loosely describe in abstract painterly marks with expressive color. I am beginning to think that my so-called abstract expressions in painting could be considered more like an accurate perception of the visual moment. My painting process is not formulaic; I prefer to work intuitively and improvisationally. This keeps my creative process challenging and fun, and I like to see that energy come through in my paintings.



My figurative paintings and other genres also incorporate a marvelous appreciation for the way light can reveal the world to us.





So, I'm working to push past my feelings of inadequacy and instead focus on the enjoyment of being surrounded by beauty, practicing, experimenting, and hoping it turns out.






Caleb Stoltzfus
